Otoplasty

Surgery to reshape the cartilage of the ears so they protrude less

Skin Surface Procedures

Surgery using lasers, chemical peels, or dermabrasion to improve the smoothness of the skin

Facial Reconstruction

Surgery to reconstruct defects in the facial skin as a result of prior surgery, injury or disease

Non-surgical Procedures

Techniques such as chemical peels, microdermabrasion and injectibles. Injectibles are medications that can be placed under the skin to improve the appearance of the face such as Botox, Xeomin, Dysport, Restylane, Juvederm, Radiesse, Sculptra and other fillers.

Dr. Recupero earned his undergraduate degree from Bowdoin College graduating Magna Cum Laude. He is a graduate of Kansas City University of Medicine and Biosciences and completed an Otolaryngology Head and Neck residency at Walter Reed Army Medical Center/National Capital Consortium in Washington, DC. After completing his residency training, he was selected as one of only 40 surgeons nation-wide for a prestigious fellowship in Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. He completed this specialized training at the world renowned McCollough Plastic Surgery Clinic in Gulf Shores, Alabama under the direction of the former president of the American Academy of Facial Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery, Dr. E. Gaylon McCollough.

Dr. Recupero is a decorated Iraq War veteran who deployed as the Otolaryngology/Facial Plastic Surgery consultant to the Surgeon General during Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation New Dawn in 2010.

He completed his active duty service obligation in 2014 as the chief of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at the Naval Medical Center in Portsmouth, Virginia where he helped teach and train Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgery residents.

Most recently, Dr. Recupero was an Otolaryngologist/Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeon at Tri-County Medical Associates in Milford.

FACIAL PLASTIC AND RECONSTRUCTIVE SURGERY SERVICES

Facial Implants

Surgery to make certain structures of the face (cheek, lips, chin) more prominent and well defined

Rhinoplasty/Septoplasty

Surgery of the external and internal nose in which cartilage and bone are reconstructed and reshaped to improve the appearance and function of the nose

Blepharoplasty

Surgery of the upper and/or lower eyelids to improve the function and/or look of the eyes

Rhytidectomy

Surgery of the skin of the face and neck to tighten the skin and remove excess wrinkles

Browlift

Surgery to improve forehead wrinkles and droopy eyebrows

Liposuction

Surgery to remove excess fat under the chin or in the neck
